This week has been as busy as usual as we continue with our 'Touch the Future' curriculum. The children have been amazing me with their computing skills and have enjoyed challenging me to beating their scores on the games they've developed. To say I've been impressed would be an understatement. In science we've been carrying out a practical investigation to find out the impact of exercise on our heart rates with some very alarming, but possibly inaccurate results. The children definitely analysed their data well when they realised that some data was probably unreliable.

I've reminded the children that they can have the lateral flow tests which are useful in highlighting people who may have the virus without realising it. A positive lateral flow should be followed up with a PCR test, which can be booked online. However, if someone has any symptoms of a new cough, high temperature or a change/loss in sense of taste or smell they should isolate immediately and book a PCR test as soon as possible. Fortunately, children are very rarely unwell with COVID but can spread the disease within our communities. We must remain vigilant especially as we move into the winter months.
