Overview

St Oswald's Catholic Primary School received £17,810 in Primary PE and Sport Premium funding during the 2025–2026 academic year. No funding remained unspent at the end of the year.

Improving the Quality of Teaching

Significant investment in staff training and professional development enhanced staff confidence, knowledge and skills in delivering high-quality PE and swimming provision.

Increasing Participation and Engagement

Funding supported a range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities, encouraging participation, teamwork and healthy lifestyles.

Enhancing Resources

New equipment and resources enriched PE lessons and broadened sporting opportunities.

Inclusion and Equal Access

Targeted support improved participation for pupils with SEND, long-term medical conditions, girls and disadvantaged pupils.

Swimming and Water Safety

61.8% of Year 6 pupils could swim 25 metres confidently and proficiently.

55.9% could use a range of strokes effectively.

School spending had a positive impact on swimming and water safety attainment.
